Curriculum:

Family Formation (Primary Grades 1st – 6th) Includes Second Grade Sacramental Preparation

Children are more likely to put into practice the faith they see lived out day-to-day at home.

There is a receptivity and vulnerability to good formation which only happens in the early years of children's development, and only in the family. A family catechesis program helps families to embrace this time and use it to form their children well.

A careful reading through the documents of the Catholic Church quickly reveals the Church's great expectations for the family. "The right and duty of parents to give education is essential ... original and primary ... and it is irreplaceable and incapable of being entirely delegated to others" [Familiaris Consortio, 36]. Christ and His Church call parents to be "the first and foremost educators of their children" [Gravissimum Educationis, 3]. Family catechesis aids families in becoming the domestic churches they are called to be. [Lumen Gentium]

Ascension Programs:

The Teen Timeline -or T3- (7th Grade)

This program is the teen version of the revolutionary *Great Adventure Bible Timeline* learning system that hundreds of thousands of Catholic adults have used to learn the Bible. The goal of this 24-lesson program is nothing short of winning over the hearts of teens and making them disciples of Christ.

One lesson will be taught each year to all students. As parents, you can opt out of the training through Safe environment and facilitate your own at home lesson with your child/ren. Please email me directly to receive the at home lesson and paperwork to opt out.

Monthly Schedule:

Each month will be referenced in a manner of weeks; Week 1, Week 2, Week 3. Due to holidays and Feasts days, week number will not always correlate with the first, second and third week of the month.

Week 1: Family Faith Formation Night

This is the monthly gathering for the entire family. Each month will have a specific topic. This topic will be presented to parents by a local speaker who will share their knowledge and testimony. Primary grades (1-7) will have classroom time with a Catechist. Older students are welcome to attend the speaker with their parents, help out in classrooms or childcare room, or have the night off if families feel this is appropriate. Families will be given monthly packets with resources and activities to incorporate into the month.

Spring dates will be sent out in the beginning of January. We want to allow parents to complete a feedback form and make any adjustments to the programming if needed .

Drop off/Pick Up Procedure:

Parking: There is parking on the east & west lots of the school, east side of church, street, and on the grass lot between cemetery and baseball field.

Drop Off: There are two main doors. The West main door is the classroom wing for grades 1-5. Attendance by grade specific Catechists will happen right as students enter the classrooms.

The East Door will be the main door for Family Faith Formation nights with Parent speaker, and for grades 6th and up!

Pick up: Parents or designated guardians/siblings will be asked to pick up students grades 1st - 5th directly from their classrooms.

Family Formation Fees:

St. Mary's Help of Christian is our central faith formation financial account keeper. Any faith formation fees payments should be addressed to and delivered to St. Mary's Help of Christian at 24588 Co Rd 7, St Augusta, MN 56301. SMHOC is responsible for handling all money associated with ACC faith formation.

The registration fee is \$30 per child, up to 3 children. The max amount a family will be required to pay for Family Faith Formation will be \$90. *St. Nicholas parish holds a specific fundraising to cover registration fees for parish families.

There is an additional Sacramental Fee of \$20 per child in sacramental preparation classes. Sacramental fees are for those in second grade (First Reconciliation & First Eucharist) and for those in Confirmation.

Scrip: If you use the Scrip program to pay for faith formation, please let Kelli know.

Meal Helpers:

To ease the hustle and bustle of Wednesday nights, we are providing a light meal for any student prior to our Faith Formation night! We are looking for a few volunteers to help out each night! Discipline:

We want to provide a positive environment for everyone. Of course, we expect that each student will demonstrate appropriate behavior such as; listening to catechists, participating in discussions, keeping hands, feet, and objects to themselves, using words that encourage and uplift, and respecting church and faith formation center property.

At times, it becomes necessary to give corrections and discipline. These steps will be taken.

 Verbal warning 2. The student will be asked to leave the room. Student then will chat with the Director, and then return to class with an apology. Parents will be notified. 3. If another incident occurs, a parent will be required to be present in the classroom for the remainder of the year. 4. If a third incident occurs, the child will be removed from the program for the remainder of the year.

Communication:

We will strive to have clear and timely communication. We have put in place several electronic ways to stay up to date. Minimal information will be mailed home to eliminate paper and postal costs. Kelli's personal cell phone number is listed, please be mindful only use this mode of communication within office hour times or in an emergency. Immediate announcements will be made through Remind App, email, and posted to our Facebook & Website page! If you have a concern, please set up a time to call or talk to Kelli in person. A lot can be misinterpreted through texts and emails.

Covid Policies:

Weather:

We will monitor weather conditions and school closures. We will do our best to make cancellation decisions as early as possible. We will send a Remind text, post to our facebook page, and send out an email. We recognize that some students may be driving independently and farther than others. You know your route, vehicle and drivers ability.

First Holy Eucharist:

The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life. Baptism is received once; Eucharist is received over and over again. Baptism initiates us into the body of Christ; Eucharist is communion with the body of Christ. Baptism is the first flow of grace; Eucharist is a fountain of ongoing grace. Baptism sets the table; Eucharist is a banquet that provides spiritual sustenance for a lifetime. Baptism is the beginning of the journey of faith on earth; Eucharist is Viaticum — given when death is imminent — and ideally is the last sacrament, and brings us home to heaven.

First Reconciliation:

Preparing children for the Sacrament of Reconciliation allows us to show them that God is love and that in mercy He is always ready to forgive, no matter what the wrong. It assures them that God already knows the secrets of our hearts, but sometimes we need to name these aloud in order to prepare our hearts to renew the experience of God's love and forgiveness. It shows them that just as God is One, God dreams that we might all be one as well--one with each other and one with God. God's will is that all people will be reconciled with one another and with God.

Curriculum: Family Formation Reconciliation booklet to be completed in the fall and Family Formation Eucharist booklet will be completed in the spring. The booklets will be completed within the classroom and some at home activities.

We will have practice the weekend before at the Mass times selected in the form. Father Matthew, Kelli, Brenda, or Lester will assign a pew for each child. Then after Mass, leaders will address any parent concerns and answer questions about the day.

Confirmation:

Confirmation deepens our baptismal life that calls us to be missionary witnesses of Jesus Christ in our families, neighborhoods, society, and the world. Through Confirmation, our personal relationship with Christ is strengthened. We receive the message of faith in a deeper and more intensive manner with great emphasis given to the person of Jesus Christ, who asked the Father to give the Holy Spirit to the Church for building up the community in loving service.

The Holy Spirit bestows seven gifts—wisdom, understanding, knowledge, fortitude, counsel, piety, and fear of the Lord—to assist us in our mission and witness. The impact of these gifts accompanies us in the various stages of our spiritual development.

As the confirmed, we walk with the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit. When we are responsive to the grace of Confirmation and the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit, we begin to bear the fruits of the Spirit. The tradition of the Church names twelve fruits of the Holy Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, generosity, gentleness, faithfulness, modesty, self-control, and chastity (cf. CCC, no. 1832; Gal 5:22).

Logistics

10th and 11th graders who have not yet been confirmed will be able to receive the sacrament of Confirmation this year. The Confirmation will be a 1 year program. Bishop Kettler's scheduling office determined the date, time and location. Confirmation students will have opportunities to grow in faith and stewardship this year. There will be once a month meeting on a Sunday night for candidates. A parent should attend the first meeting, if a parent isn't able to attend another trusted adult can take the place. The first meeting we will discuss spiritual and service house, sponsor selection, saint study and how to meditate on the weekly gospels. It is strongly encouraged that those in Confirmation attend the secondary Week 2 & 3 dates.

Fall Class Dates are: 10/24, 11/21, 12/5 from 6:30-8:00 pm at Holy Cross

Confirmation Retreat: March 5th from 10:45 - 6:00 pm at Holy Cross.

If a candidate cannot make the retreat, it will be up to the candidate to schedule and attend another local retreat
